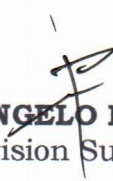

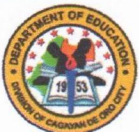

EDUCATION FOR CLIMATE ACTION

About Change the Current 2.0

Change the Current (CTC) is the climate education and action program of the non-profit marine conservation organization Save Philippine Seas (SPS). It began in 2020 as a series of infographics on climate change, its impacts on the Philippines, and what actions Filipinos can take on climate change adaptation and mitigation (CCAM).

In 2021, SPS, in partnership with UNICEF Philippines and the Department of Education-Disaster Risk Reduction Management Services (DepEd-DRRMS), co-managed **CTC 1.0**, an innovative co-curricular online training program that aimed to maximize the suitability and flexibility of co-curricular interventions to advocate for CCAM-focused learning and behavioral change. CTC was implemented to facilitate adolescent empowerment and civic engagement through participatory and meaningful community-based climate action. The program was divided in two age groups (10-14 years old and 15-19 years old) with 30 participants each in the following divisions: Valenzuela City, Albay, Western Samar, and Dipolog City.

In 2022, SPS, in partnership with the U.S. Embassy in the Philippines, implemented the Young Southeast Asian Leaders Initiative-Change the Current (YCTC). **YCTC** was designed for an older age group (18-23 years old) and targeted emerging youth leaders from across the country. It had an online training program and in-person summit held in Subic.

Background on Change the Current 2.0

Building on the lessons from CTC 1.0 and YCTC, SPS, UNICEF Philippines, and DepEd-DRRMS developed CTC 2.0, carrying the tagline "Education for Climate Action." It expands CTC 1.0 by having a nationwide program and targeting more adolescent learners, teachers, and communities in the process. It aims to achieve the following results:

- (i) Enhanced capacity of DepEd in implementing the Change the Current Programme at the school division-level;
- (ii) Heightened self-efficacy among educators and adolescents to co-design and implement climate action activities relevant to their local communities; and
- (iii) Strengthened Climate Education and Action Community of Practice.

CTC 2.0 Training Program

In 2023, the initial run of CTC 2.0's two-day training program was successfully implemented in selected priority areas/School Divisions of UNICEF. The initial run trained a total of 142 participants inclusive of teachers and division office representatives from Valenzuela, Northern Samar, Samar, and Zamboanga Del Norte. The trained teachers are now in the process of rolling out climate change education-related activities to at least 40 students from May to August 2023.

CTC 2.0 will be holding another series of workshops in July 2023 to help scale its outlined goals and objectives. The program hopes to engage the following teacher-participants:

Target teacher-participants

- Junior and senior high school teachers from Valenzuela City, Angeles City, and Cagayan De Oro Divisions.
- They must be teaching any of these subjects: Health, Science, Araling Panlipunan, and Edukasyon sa Pagpapakatao, English, Filipino, Edukasyong Pantahanan at Pangkabuhayan, Mathematics, Technology and Livelihood Economics, Technical and Vocational Education, Music Arts and PE, among others.

Role of teacher-participants

Teacher-participants are expected to be:

- actively participating in the training program
- teaching at least 40 students about CCAM concepts upon return to school divisions within a four-month period

This module will guide the teacher-participants in developing the action and lesson plan. Session 1 and 2 are designed to increase knowledge on climate change and CCAM strategies, while Sessions 3 to 5 are intended to guide the teacher-participants in completing their climate change-related lesson plans.

Terms of Reference:

Project Duration: June 2023 to July 2023

Workshop Dates the Division of Cagayan De Oro: July 7 and 8, 2023

Save Philippine Seas shall:

1. With the help of UNICEF Philippines, fund all the workshop expenses that will be incurred such as professional fees of the training team, transportation expenses of the workshop team and participants, board and lodging, venue, and workshop materials.
2. Create and provide all the learning materials needed for the workshops such as modules and group activity materials
3. Facilitate the workshop and provide mentorship and guidance to the participants in terms of environmental education, lesson planning, and project management

DepEd Divisions shall:

1. Assist in the selection of, and coordination with, 40 teachers who will participate in CTC 2.0 training workshop to be held in Cagayan De Oro City on July 7 and 8, 2023. The complete list of participants should be given to SPS by June 26, 2023.
2. Provide logistical support in the implementation of the CTC 2.0 training program which include but not limited to:
 - a. Ensure that all selected participants were allowed and are excused from their professional obligations during the three-day training period;
 - b. Support and provide guidance to the participants who are selected to receive seed funding in implementing their community-based climate initiatives;
 - c. Allow all CTC 2.0 participants to teach the CCAM concepts they will learn from the workshop to be taught to at least 40 students (per teacher).
 - d. Assist Save Philippine Seas in the teacher participants' post-workshop deliverables which include the collection of lesson plans and necessary documentation as proof of the teacher-participants' progress and activities, etc.
