

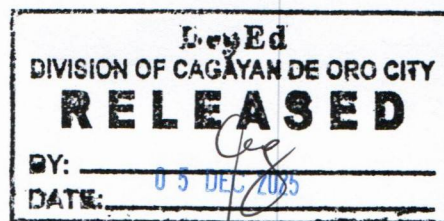

LANDAS 2026: A DIVISION CAREER EXPO

I. RATIONALE

To provide clear and structured guidance for learners as they prepare for their transition beyond basic education, the Schools Division of Cagayan de Oro will conduct the Division Career Expo 2026 on January 15, 2026, at the Division Conference Hall. This initiative aims to empower Grade 12 learners to explore various curriculum exits and gain meaningful insights that will help them make informed decisions regarding higher education, employment, entrepreneurship, and middle-skill opportunities, bringing together government agencies, private institutions, and industry partners to support students' personal and professional development.

II. OBJECTIVES

- Guide learners in understanding the different curriculum exits and possible career pathways after Senior High School.
- Provide access to relevant information from partner agencies, organizations, and private institutions through talks, presentations, and interactive sessions.
- Expose students to real-world opportunities through a structured Career Fair featuring booths from various sectors.
- Enable learners to make informed and confident decisions regarding their chosen career paths.

III. PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

Time	Activity	Description
8:00 – 9:30 AM	Preliminaries	Invocation, Nationalistic Song, Welcome Message from ASDS Audie Borres, and Inspirational Message from SDS Roy Angelo E. Gazo.
9:30 – 10:30 AM	Discovering Your Ikigai	A reflective session to help learners identify their passions, strengths, and aspirations.
10:30 – 12:30 PM	Career Talk	Short presentations from key agencies: CID (curriculum exits), PESO (employment), CEDO (higher education), TESDA (middle skills), DTI (entrepreneurship), followed by an open forum with speakers.
1:00 – 3:00 PM	Career Fair	Learners visit booths from various sectors and are required to explore at least four (4) booths under each category or curriculum exit.
3:00 – 4:00 PM	Industry Showcase	Participating offices, organizations, and institutions present their services, programs, and opportunities in an open, interactive session.
4:30 PM	Closing Program	Formal closing of the activity with Closing Remarks delivered by SGOD Chief Rosalio Vitorillo.
