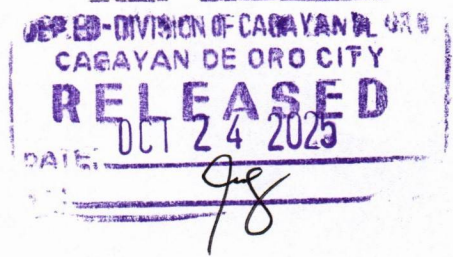

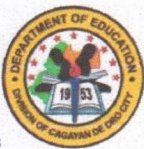

**CONTEST GUIDELINES AND MECHANICS FOR THE 2025 REGIONAL CLIMATE
CHANGE CARAVAN ACTIVITIES**

TO: **All Public and Private Elementary and Secondary School Heads**

1. -Entries for the Best Invention/Breakthrough/Initiative/Project contest must likewise be submitted electronically to essd.region10@deped.gov.ph through the designated online portal on or before October 31, 2025.

7. All submitted entries will be featured during the culmination activity on November 4, 2025, at Booboc National High School (BNHS). Winning participants shall receive recognition and eco-friendly rewards.

8. Schools are encouraged to promote wide participation and integrate the activity into school-based climate change awareness and DRRM initiatives.

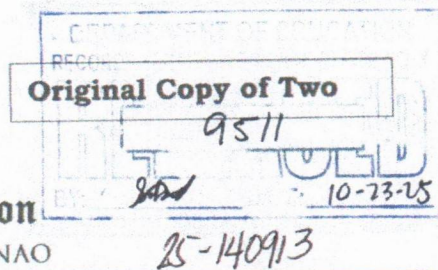

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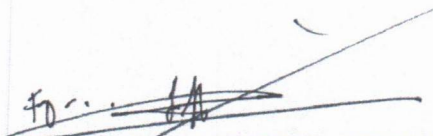

TIKTOK ADVOCACY CONTEST

1. The Regional Climate Change Caravan 2025, spearheaded by this Office, is open to elementary and secondary learners from different Schools Division Offices (SDOs) in Region X who want to participate in this contest.
2. The participants are encouraged to create Original TikTok videos focusing on the following:
 - a. Climate change awareness and action
 - b. Disaster risk reduction and preparedness
 - c. Sustainable practices (e.g., Gulayan sa Paaralan, waste management)
 - d. Youth-led climate solutions and innovations
3. The following are the video requirements:
 - a. Duration: 15 to 60 seconds
 - b. Format: Clear visuals and audio with school-appropriate music only
 - c. Language: English, Filipino, or local dialect
4. Each video must include at least three of the following official hashtags:
 - a. #BeatClimateChange
 - b. #GreenFuture
 - c. #DRRMGPPBigaTen
5. Videos must comply with the Child Protection Policy, Data Privacy Act, and other applicable laws. Parental consent is required for minors. Content must avoid political, discriminatory, violent, or harmful material. Respect copyright and prioritize safety by avoiding hazardous filming conditions.
6. Each division may submit a maximum of three entries. The video output must be submitted on or before October 31.
7. The participants must post their TikTok videos on a Public Account with the required hashtags and submit the video link to essd.region10@deped.gov.ph.

**BEST INVENTION/BREAKTHROUGH/INITIATIVE/PROJECT IMPACTING
GULAYAN SA PAARALAN, CLIMATE CHANGE, AND DRRM IN DEPED SCHOOLS**

Contest Overview:

This contest aims to recognize and promote innovative projects, initiatives, inventions, and breakthroughs that have a significant impact on *Gulayan sa Paaralan* (School Gardens), Climate Change, and Disaster Risk Reduction and Management (DRRM) in the Department of Education (DepEd) schools. The entries should reflect sustainable solutions, environmental impact, and practical applications that align with the national and local goals of promoting sustainability, climate resilience, and safe learning environments.

Contest Coverage:

Gulayan sa Paaralan (School Gardens) Inventions or Initiatives

- Projects that enhance the sustainability, productivity, or educational value of school gardens.
 - Innovative ways to integrate school gardens with curricula or community activities.
- Climate Change Initiatives or Breakthroughs
- Projects focused on mitigating or adapting to climate change in the school or community setting.
 - Solutions for reducing the carbon footprint, conserving resources, or promoting environmental stewardship in schools.
- Disaster Risk Reduction and Management (DRRM)
- Initiatives that improve disaster preparedness, response, recovery, or resilience in DepEd schools.
 - Projects aimed at creating safer, more resilient learning environments against natural hazards such as floods, earthquakes, or typhoons.

Eligibility:

Who can participate: All Schools Division Offices (DOs) nationwide are eligible to submit one entry per division (either from public or private schools).

Each division may submit only one entry that can be a project, initiative, invention, or breakthrough directly impacting any of the focus areas: *Gulayan sa Paaralan*, Climate Change, or DRRM.

Individual/Project Team: Entries must be implemented by an individual or team of DepEd personnel, including school administrators, teachers, students, or school-based stakeholders.



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Submission Requirements:

Project Description: Provide a clear description of the project or initiative, including the problem it addresses, objectives, and the methodology used. The description must be a maximum of 2 pages.

Implementation Details: Describe how the project was implemented (timelines, teams involved, resources, etc.), and how it impacted the school or community. Include any photos, reports, or other evidence of success.

Sustainability Plan: The project should have a sustainability or long-term impact. Describe how the project will continue or how it can be scaled up for future impact. Provide a sustainability plan.

Innovation & Creativity: Explain how the project demonstrates creative thinking or technological advancement that sets it apart from existing practices.

Results/Impact: Provide measurable outcomes and benefits of the project. This could include improvements in school garden productivity, reductions in carbon emissions, improved DRRM readiness, etc.

Supporting Documents/Multimedia:

Photos, videos, or diagrams that illustrate the project.

Any relevant research, data, or reports supporting the project's effectiveness and impact.

Judging Criteria:

Entries will be evaluated based on the following criteria, each with a specific weight:

Innovation and Creativity (25%)

Uniqueness and originality of the project or solution.

Novel use of technology or resources.

Relevance to Focus Areas (20%)

How well the project addresses the goals of Gulayan sa Paaralan, Climate Change, or DRRM.

Alignment with DepEd's vision for sustainable education and community development.

Impact and Effectiveness (25%)

Demonstrable impact on the school or community in terms of sustainability, resilience, or environmental awareness.

Quantifiable outcomes, such as the number of students benefiting, resources saved, or reduced vulnerabilities.



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Sustainability and Scalability (15%)

Long-term viability of the project.

Potential for replication or scaling in other schools or communities.

Community Involvement (10%)

Participation of students, parents, teachers, and the community in the implementation and sustainability of the project.

Presentation (5%)

Clarity and quality of the project presentation, including written descriptions, multimedia, and other supporting materials.

Submission Process:

Nomination: Each Division Office is responsible for selecting one project/initiative from their respective divisions.

Deadline: All submissions must be sent electronically at essd.region10@deped.gov.ph or via the designated online submission portal on or before October 31, 2025.

Submission Format:

All submissions should be in PDF format (for the written description and supporting documents) and MP4 or JPEG format (for multimedia files like photos and videos).

Include a cover sheet with the project title, Division Office name, and contact details of the project coordinator.

Review Process: A panel of judges will review all submissions and may request additional information or clarification during the evaluation process.

Awards and Prizes:

First Place/Second Place/Third Place

A special trophy/plaque recognizing the project as the most impactful invention, breakthrough, or initiative.

Certificates of recognition for the team members and the Division Office and possible grants for further development of the project.

Opportunity to be featured in the ESSD and DepEd Region 10 Official FB Page and connect with potential partners.

Additional Guidelines:

Confidentiality: All submissions must be the original work of the student/employee from the 14 Schools Division Offices in Region 10 and must not infringe on intellectual property rights. The DepEd Region 10 reserves the right to publicize the projects.



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Monitoring and Verification: The DepEd may visit schools or request additional evidence to verify the impact of the projects.

Rights: By entering the contest, participants grant DepEd Region 10 permission to use any materials submitted (photos, videos, descriptions) for promotional purposes.

Legal Compliance: All projects must adhere to existing laws, DepEd regulations, and ethical standards, particularly concerning environmental sustainability and child protection.
