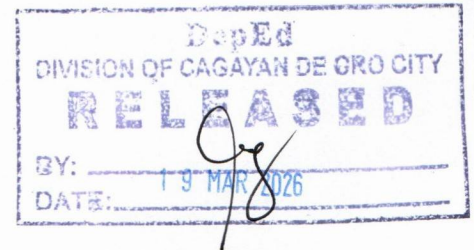

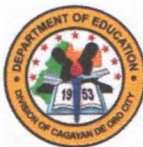

CRITERIA

Poster Making Contest

A. Originality and Creativity (50%)

- Posters must be original and created specifically for the contest, related to the topic and make it easier to understand.
- Posters should focus on Rabies Awareness Month, emphasizing prevention, education, and awareness. With the theme “Rabies-Free na Pusa’t Aso, Kaligtasan ng Pamilyang Pilipino”.

B. Accuracy and Content (30%)

- Should be designed for the general public, with a focus on pet owners, children, and communities at risk.

C. Visual impact and design (10%)

- The poster is exceptionally attractive in terms of design, layout, and neatness. The overall organization and use of color and space make the poster interesting.

D. Overall Impact and Effectiveness (10%)

- Provides Public education and awareness, these campaigns can help prevent animal bites by promoting responsible pet ownership and teaching family members how to interact safely with animals.

Slogan Making Contest

A. Relevance to Theme (50%)

- How well does the slogan align with the theme “**Rabies-Free na Pusa’t Aso, Kaligtasan ng Pamilyang Pilipino**”.
- The written Slogan has the best choice of words, convey strong message, catchy and very relevant to the theme.

B. Originality (30%)

- Exceptional use of new ideas and originality to create a slogan.

C. Emotional Resonance (10%)

- Does the slogan evoke emotions, such as inspiration, motivation or empathy?

D. Call-to-Action (10%)

- Does the slogan encourage the audience to take action or engage with the theme?
- How likely is the slogan to have a lasting impact and remain relevant overtime?



Video Interpretative Contest

A. Originality and Creativity (50%)

- The video presentation must be original and created specifically for the related to the topic and make it easier to understand. Should be clear and precise information/message in spreading Rabies Awareness.
- Video should focus on Rabies Awareness Month, emphasizing prevention, education, and awareness. With the theme “Rabies-Free na Pusa’t Aso, Kaligtasan ng Pamilyang Pilipino”.

B. Accuracy and Content (30%)

- Should be designed for the general public, with a focus on pet owners, children, and communities at risk. It should include RA 9482 “Anti-Rabies Act of 2007”

D. Overall Impact and Effectiveness (20%)

- Provides Public education and awareness, these campaigns can help prevent animal bites by promoting responsible pet ownership, teaching family members how to interact safely with animals and Do’s and Don’ts should be visible in the presentation.
